*A graduate with her Doctorate in American history, from the University of Rochester, Dr. Suzanne Schnittman has made numerous contributions to academia and social awareness issues.*

*Her teaching career includes positions held at St. John Fisher College, S.U.N.Y. College at Brockport, Hobart and Williams Smith Colleges and Wells College.*

*As Past President of Feminists for Life of New York and speaker for the New York State Council for the Humanities, Dr. Schnittman provides an interesting commentary on women's, peace, and justice issues with a historical context.*

*Schnittman was a past co-editor of World Hunger Newsletter and a leader in the US Sanctuary and anti-nuclear movement in the mid-1980's. She currently is on the Board of Directors of New Yorkers against the Death Penalty and coordinator of the Reconciliation Network in Rochester New York.*
