Frances E Willard, "A Plea for the Forgotten" (letter)

"TO THE UNION SIGNAL: — I have this week visited the H. C. Anchorage for Girls, on Wabash avenue, founded some yrs ago by the Central W.C.T.U.

I found more than thirty-five ♀, some of them pitifully young, + twelve w/ babies in their arms. It was a sight to make careless hearts thoughtful + steady eyes dim. The poor child who was deceived, betrayed + ruined a few days ago by the man she trusted, + who tried to take her young life, was there. At least she had found those whom she could trust, who told her they would do all in their power to help her build her wrecked young life anew on the faths of industry, purity, + honor.

"Some of us talked to these forgotten ones as helpfully + kindly as we could, + then they spoke to us w/ tears, of their gratitude for a home so friendly + mother-hearts so sheltering as those of Miss Alice Bond, who has stood by the work for yrs. w/ a heroism that knew no defeat in the darkest his; Miss Lyman, the matron, who has the love + good-will of every person connected w/ the Anchorage; Mrs. E P Vale, whom they term 'the mother of us all,' + other true + noble ♀ who make this home their special work."

(plea for fund raising)

"... & make this plea b/c I feel sure that there are a sufficient # of good + true ♂ + ♀ to pay this sum for these deceived + defrauded ones, if only the facts are brought to their knowledge... let us remember our sisters who are 'in bonds, as bound w/ them,' let us not forget that our blessed Lord was more considerate toward the Magdalenes than toward any others, b/c they most needed the comfort of His presence + the strength of His uplifting spirit."

its work - "to visit the slums, station-houses, + hospitals, rescuing ♀ + girls, taking them off the streets + caring for them until situations or homes can be provided for them. 100s have gone out fr. this mission who are now earning an honorable living, while many others have been sent to their own homes + have been restored to their friends or parents."  
"For 8 yrs it has rescued ♀, helped innocent + friendless girls + cared for young mothers + their babies. Last yr. 242 diff young ♀ + girls found help + situations + 2,000 lodgings were given."

close Mission's location + "entered upon her career w/ great enthusiasm."  
A ssoc. w/ Josephine Butler through World's WCTU.  
Then "Miss Alice Bond" of Evanston, assumed the leadership of the A,  
wh. has grown steadily.
